Paul McAuley (UK)

Paul McAuley is a British botanist and award-winning author. His first novel, *Four Hundred Billion Stars*, won the Philip K. Dick Award in 1988, while *Fairyland* won the 1996 Arthur C. Clarke Award and the 1997 John W. Campbell Memorial Award for Best SF Novel. His short story, "The Temptation of Dr. Stein", won the British Fantasy Award. *Pasquale's Angel* won the Sidewise Award for Alternate History (Long Form).

His latest series is *The Quiet War* Series which consist of the novels *The Quiet War, Gardens of the Sun, In the Mouth of the Whale* and *Evening's Empires*. His latest collection is A Very British History.

Karin Tidbeck (SE)

Swedish author Karin Tidbeck has published fiction in Swedish since 2002 and in English since 2010. She is the winner of the Crawford Award 2013 for her first English collection *Jagannath: Stories*, which was also nominated for a World Fantasy Award and was on the honor list for the Tiptree Award 2012. Her first novel *Amatka* is available in Swedish, as well as her collection *Vem är Arvid Pekon*?

She is a graduate of the Clarion Writer's Workshop and has published stories at *Tor.com, Strange Horizons, Lightspeed Magazine, Weird Tales* and *Shimmer Magazine*. Her short story "Beatrice" has been adapted by the puppetry troupe Tidsrum (DK/UK) and will premiere in June on the Danish island of Bornholm.

Rochita Loenen-Ruiz (PH/NL)

Filipina author Rochita Loenen-Ruiz' short fiction has appeared in a variety of online and print publications, including Fantasy Magazine, Apex Magazine, Interzone, Realms of Fantasy, The Apex Book of World SF 2, Robots: The Recent A.I. (anthology), the Weird Fiction Review and Weird Tales Magazine. Her essays and reviews have also been published in a variety of venues. She writes a column called "Movements" which is published online at Strange Horizons. She attended the Clarion West Writer's Workshop in Seattle in 2009. She was the recipient of the Octavia Butler Scholarship in 2009 and was the first Filipina writer to attend Clarion West.
